8 a.m. – 12 p.m. – Hostage Negotiations for Dispatchers and Call Takers

Telecommunicators may answer a call & have first contact with hostages or the hostage takers themselves. This course will provide necessary skills to keep a person in crisis on the phone until a negotiator can arrive on scene. This course does not take the place of formal negotiations training, but will give the dispatcher a basic understanding of Hostage Negotiations.

1 – 3 p.m. – Case Study on PTSD barricades

This case study involves a suicidal combat veteran suffering from PTSD and illustrates many of the points discussed in the morning portion of the class, with actual negotiation audio. This particular incident occurred in May of 2016 and the information contained is current and useful to assist in PTSD or combat veteran barricades and the preparation for those barricades.

3– 4:00 p.m. – Case Studies involving Police Officer barricades

This case study will outline instances when a Police Officer or Military Personnel is the suspect involved in an active barricade. Topics discussed will be Officer Safety as well as inherent obstacles in dealing with this type of barricaded suspect.
